MEASURING EFFECTIVENESS

Showing academic (and measurable non-academic) growth in a microschool setting is important, and there are many ways that you can track and measure progress.

As a microschooling leader, measuring growth is an important decision. There are a vast number of tools and ways to measure what a child is learning in a year. These range from assessments given by a third party, to built in assessments in your learning software, to less-traditional means such as competing in outside contests and keeping a portfolio of work. Decide which methods you will be using, and have a conversation about that with your families. It's important to make sure that parents know exactly how their child will be measured and what updates and reports they can expect from you.

Measuring growth can show stakeholders the high academic gains that are so often sought after and yet far less often achieved in other schooling settings.
