ROADMAP TO STARTING



START WITH YOUR IDEA

Why do you want to start a microschool? Who do you want to serve? What will your focus be (self-directed, project-based, Montessori or a combination of philosophies and approaches)? Take a look at the information on our website, <u>microschoolingcenter.org</u>, including our video library, and information regarding the four different tracks we see for microschooling - independent, partnership, provider network and public. Give some thought to what sounds like a good fit to you. We have different resources available for each path.

ATTEND OUR MICROSCHOOL MAKERS ON MONDAY MEETING

We host a Microschool Makers meeting once a month (typically on the third Monday). These are small group meetings designed for us to get to know you and you to get to know what the Center offers. This is a great way to connect with our team and receive the support you need.

TALK TO YOUR COMMUNITY

Talk about your idea with families in your community. Get a sense of who is interested, who your learners will be, and what their needs are (including scheduling needs). We can help you hold informational sessions and connect with families.



RESEARCH YOUR STATE AND LOCAL FRAMEWORKS

If you will be operating a microschool, it is important that you understand your obligations as they relate to licensing, background checks, and other requirements. Familiarize yourself with your local and state policies. Consider if it makes the most sense for you to open as a nonpublic school or a learning center serving homeschooling children. Consider what this means for business licensing, zoning, etc.



WRITE A PLAN

Begin your business plan, Think through your vision and mission. Begin budgeting (be mindful of planning to start small and grow – most microschools stay small until the second semester). Consider a timeline for launch. Think through your teaching and learning tools, facilities, creating a handbook and more.



FIND A FACILITY

Secure a facility. Keep in mind, depending on how you choose to open, you might need certain approval before opening and you might not be able to get these approvals before signing a lease. Try to have a clause in your lease that lets you out of the lease if the space does not pass all inspections.

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Think through ways of marketing your microschool (and be mindful of regulations and how you are opening, if you receive regulatory pushback, please reach out to us!). Microschool founders have seen success with: weekend workshops, farmers markets, school choice fairs and more. Hold regular microschooling meetings to help educate the general community on what microschooling is (we have resources to help with these meetings). Be consistent and open to feedback.

Not necessarily. You can host a microschool without enrolling your own children. While many start as an option for the founder's own children, plenty of microschool founders do not have their children in their microschool. T


